STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES

Individual Education Plan (IEP): In general, students are assessed on the Learning Standards of the curriculum. A mark may not be used when your child is being assessed only on their IEP goals. Their learning update will still include descriptive feedback describing what your child can do and the areas they are still working on.

English Language Learner (ELL): If English language skills make it difficult for child to fully show their learning; in place of a mark, your child's report card will have written comments describing their strengths and areas they can work on. Once your child has the English skills that allow them to show their learning, they will be given a Proficiency Scale or letter grade.
